Two hearts pump blood to the gills, while the third heart pumps blood to the rest of the body. This amazing circulatory system helps us survive in low-oxygen environments.

TOP THREATS

Our biggest threats are from predators like sharks. Ocean pollution harms our environment and the creatures we rely on for food. Overfishing by humans means there is less food, and climate change disrupts our underwater ecosystem.

Habitat destruction makes it harder for us to find safe places to live and reproduce. It's important for people to be aware of these threats and work together to protect our ocean homes so that we can thrive in our underwater world.
